#### **Executive Summary**

This informational report provides the status as of December 31, 2011, of the allocations, obligations, and expenditures of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) disaster recovery funds the State of Louisiana received from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development as a result of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita and Hurricanes Gustav and Ike. This report follows up on information we provided to the Select Committee on Hurricane Recovery in March 2010. We obtained this information with the assistance of the Office of Community Development Disaster Recovery Unit (OCD/DRU) staff. Appendix A contains our scope and methodology. The objectives and the results of our work are as follows:

**Objective 1:** What are the CDBG allocations, obligations, and expenditures for Hurricanes Katrina and Rita as of December 31, 2011?

**Results:** As of December 31, 2011, Louisiana has allocated approximately \$13.2 billion in CDBG funds to various Hurricanes Katrina and Rita-related programs. Of this amount, approximately \$13.0 billion (98%) has been obligated. Of the allocated amount, approximately \$11.8 billion (89%) has been expended and \$1.4 billion (11%) remains. See Appendix B for a breakdown of CDBG allocations, obligations, and expenditures categorized by individual programs and by award and non-award expenditures.

**Objective 2:** What are the CDBG allocations, obligations, and expenditures for Hurricanes Gustav and Ike as of December 31, 2011?

**Results:** As of December 31, 2011, Louisiana has allocated approximately \$1.1 billion in CDBG funds to various Hurricanes Gustav and Ike-related programs. Of this amount, approximately \$938.6 million (86%) has been obligated. Of the allocated amount, approximately \$217 million (20%) has been expended and \$876 million (80%) remains. See Appendix C for a breakdown of CDBG allocations, obligations, and expenditures categorized by individual programs and by award and non-award expenditures.

#### **Background**

The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program at the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development is a flexible program that provides resources to assist communities with a wide range of developmental needs. The CDBG program works to ensure decent affordable housing, to provide services to the most vulnerable in our communities, and to create jobs through the expansion and retention of businesses.

In response to disasters, Congress can appropriate additional funding for the CDBG program as disaster recovery grants to rebuild the affected areas and provide seed money to start the recovery process. These communities must have significant unmet recovery needs and the capacity to carry out a disaster recovery program. In Louisiana, Hurricanes Katrina, Rita, Gustav, and Ike met these criteria. The Office of Community Development Disaster Recovery Unit (OCD/DRU) administers the disaster recovery funds related to these hurricanes.

Hurricanes Katrina and Rita occurred in August and September of 2005, respectively. As of December 31, 2011, Congress has appropriated approximately \$13.2 billion to the state in CDBG funds to assist with recovery efforts related to these disasters.

Hurricanes Gustav and Ike occurred in September of 2008. As of December 31, 2011, Congress has appropriated approximately \$1.1 billion to the state in CDBG funds to assist with recovery efforts related to these disasters.

## Objective 1: What are the CDBG allocations, obligations, and expenditures for Hurricanes Katrina and Rita as of December 31, 2011?

As of December 31, 2011, OCD/DRU has allocated<sup>3</sup> approximately \$13.2 billion in CDBG funds to various Hurricanes Katrina and Rita-related programs. Of this amount, approximately \$13.0 billion (98%) has been obligated.<sup>4</sup> Of the allocated amount, approximately \$11.8 billion (89%) has been expended and \$1.4 billion (11%) remains. Exhibit 1 provides a summary of CDBG allocations, obligations, and expenditures by program type for Hurricanes Katrina and Rita.

Of this amount, approximately \$938.6 million (86%) has been obligated. Of the allocated amount, approximately \$217 million (20%) has been expended and \$876 million (80%) remains. #### APPENDIX A: SCOPE AND METHODOLOGY

Louisiana Revised Statute 25:513(D)(4) directs the Louisiana Legislative Auditor to conduct performance audits, program evaluations, and other studies to enable the legislature and its committees to evaluate the efficiency, effectiveness, and operation of state programs and activities. This informational report provides the status of the allocations, obligations, and expenditures of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) disaster recovery funding the State of Louisiana received from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development as a result of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita and Hurricanes Gustav and Ike, as of December 31, 2011. This report follows up on information we provided to the Select Committee on Hurricane Recovery in March 2010. We obtained this information with the assistance of the Office of Community Development Disaster Recovery Unit (OCD/DRU) staff. Because this is an informational report, we did not conduct this project in accordance with all governmental auditing standards. The objectives were to answer the following questions:

- 1. What are the CDBG allocations, obligations, and expenditures for Hurricanes Katrina and Rita as of December 31, 2011?
- 2. What are the CDBG allocations, obligations, and expenditures for Hurricanes Gustav and Ike as of December 31, 2011?

To answer the audit objectives, we conducted the following procedures:

- Met with OCD/DRU staff to obtain allocated, obligated, and expended CDBG funds data.
- Worked with Louisiana Legislative Auditor Financial Audit Services staff to obtain corroborating data on expenditures from ISIS (both award and non-award expenditures) to support OCD/DRU's expenditure data.
- Met with OCD/DRU staff and Louisiana Legislative Auditor Financial Audit Services staff to ensure the proper categorization of award and non-award expenditures because of changes to ISIS codes since start of program.
